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FOR YOUR INFORMATION

The potential for duplication of HIV and AIDS cases has become more of an issue because of the mobility of our society and also because of the success of treatment for HIV disease. Persons with HIV disease may move for reasons related to their infection, for example, to be near family and friends, to seek more knowledgeable physicians, or because of inability to work due to HIV disease. With the advent and success of highly active antiretroviral therapy, those persons living relatively healthy lives may move for reasons unrelated to HIV or AIDS – to seek out new job opportunities or simply to fulfill a dream of living in a different place. This mobility increases the challenge of avoiding duplication in counting persons with AIDS across different jurisdictions throughout the US.

The potential for duplication has increased since HIV case reporting has been implemented. This has occurred because there are more records for the same person over time. To counter the potential problem of duplication, the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention initiated the Interstate Duplication Evaluation Project (IDEP) in 2002. This considerable effort compared patient records in the national database across states in order to identify potential duplicate cases. Duplications were identified through this process and de-duplication needed to occur.

Through IDEP, the Illinois Department of Public Health HIV/AIDS Surveillance Unit identified Illinois AIDS cases that were, in fact, residents of another state or territory at the time of their initial diagnosis of AIDS. The November 2004 *Illinois HIV/AIDS/STD Monthly Surveillance Update* report reflects the decrease in numbers of AIDS cases in each city/county health jurisdiction. HIV data were not affected by the IDEP match. Within the next few weeks, the Surveillance Unit will provide the appropriate jurisdictions with a list of cases that will no longer be reflected in their AIDS statistics. The de-duplication effort will result in more accurate state and national AIDS case counts by lessening the chance that any person will be counted more than once by AIDS surveillance
