Summary:

The more a child knows about what makes them special, unique and valued the more respect and enthusiasm they have for life. The Humanology Mobile Classroom prepares young children to be healthy, intelligent and *drug free*. This world class curriculum combines comprehensive prevention education related to drug use, violence, HIV/AIDS, asthma, diabetes and obesity with the most advanced technology and scientific teaching tools in a self contained interactive mobile classroom. Specially trained educators use a *transparent anatomical mannequin (TAM), moving body modules that illustrate body functions, laser quality audio / visuals, and an illuminated star filled ceiling all custom built into the mobile classroom to give children a unique learning experience. Students gain valuable life skills while exploring the sciences of biology, anatomy, and ecology with lessons aligned to meet Illinois State Learning Standards in science, health and social education. Through the interactive technology students gain a visual understanding of the uniqueness of human life and how to protect it. Each lesson is grade appropriate and builds from one level to the next to continuously engage children in the scientific discovery of themselves.*

Need:

Research indicates that prevention begins with having the right information and skills at an early age to develop healthy life-long skills. By the age of adolescence and as early as the preteen years, children have already been influenced by negative behavior patterns in their environment and may be pre-disposed in some cases to disease. For these children prevention is vital. The Humanology Mobile Classroom targets children from K-8th grade (ages 5-14) with a powerful experience that does more than just provide information. Format:

FORUM offers a battery of programs and services, including Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention and Teen Pregnancy Prevention that work in conjunction with the Humanology Mobile Classroom to provide school based classroom sessions, individual and small group consultations and referral services. The Humanology Mobile Classroom component targets children from kindergarten through 8th grade (ages 5 – 14) and has also been successfully piloted with high school students focusing on teen pregnancy prevention, HIV/AIDS prevention and violence prevention. Teacher and parent programs are available to continue this unique learning experience outside of the mobile classroom. Teachers participate in in-service trainings / orientations to introduce the Humanology Mobile Classroom and provide ways for integration of information into the school curriculum. The parent program corresponds with the student curriculum emphasizing prevention strategies for parents to use at home.

Outcomes:

The Humanology Mobile Classroom targets children when they are most vulnerable and receptive to learn and to change. Within each of the grade level interactive presentations is an underlying message of self-respect, self-control and self-sufficiency that is needed to support youth in making healthy life choices.
