Why is antibiotic misuse a concern?

- ♦ As much as **50%** of antibiotics prescribed for people are **unnecessary or inappropriate**.
- ♦ Inappropriate antibiotic use **jeopardizes** the **effectiveness** of these vital drugs.
- ◆ At least **2 million** people become **infected** with antibiotic resistant bacteria each year in the U.S.
- ◆ At least 23,000 people die each year in the U.S. as a direct result of these infections. More Details
