

Introduction

The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) STD Program is pleased to present the *2002 Illinois Sexually Transmitted Diseases Summary*. This summary provides statistics and trends of reported sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) in Illinois for 1992-2002 and consists of five sections: Illinois 2002 epidemiologic summary; Illinois statewide statistics tables; and chlamydia, gonorrhea and syphilis cases, rates and county statistics tables. Data from IDPH laboratories on viral STDs (herpes and hepatitis C) from testing performed at STD clinics and selected outreach sites also are presented in this summary.

The Illinois Control of Sexually Transmitted Diseases Code [77 Illinois Administrative Code 693] requires physicians, laboratories and blood banks to report within seven days to the local health authority (i.e., county/city health department or IDPH for jurisdictions where there is no health department) all diagnosed cases and positive laboratory findings of reportable STDs (syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia and chancroid). Reports of diagnosed cases of reportable STDs are submitted by health care providers on morbidity reporting forms, "Confidential Morbidity Report of Sexually Transmitted Diseases," furnished by IDPH. These morbidity reports are submitted to the local health authority and then forwarded to IDPH. Morbidity data are tabulated by program staff from these reports.

STD case rates for 1992-1999 were calculated using population figures from 1990 U.S. census data, and 2000-2002 case rates were calculated using population data from the 2000 U.S. census. Rates reflect the number of cases per 100,000 population. Congenital syphilis rates represent the number of infants with congenital syphilis per 100,000 births in each of the respective years. The source for all charts and tables included in this summary is the IDPH STD Program. Selected tables are also available by Internet via the IDPH home page at <www.idph.state.il.us>.

This report was prepared by IDPH STD Program staff.

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The STD Section acknowledges and appreciates the efforts of local health departments, hospitals, physicians and laboratories to report STDs and of IDPH support staff for processing and tabulating the reports.

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
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Illinois Counties




Illinois STD Clinic Sites by City




2002 Chlamydia Summary

Chlamydia trachomatis infection is a significant cause of genitourinary complications, especially in women. Early symptoms are often mild, and asymptomatic infection is common in both men and women. Untreated chlamydia in women may lead to pelvic inflammatory disease (PID) with severe fallopian tube inflammation and damage. Chlamydia is a major cause of long-term sequelae such as tubal infertility and ectopic pregnancy and can cause premature rupture of membranes in pregnant women. Newborns exposed during birth may develop ophthalmia or pneumonia.

In Illinois, a case of chlamydia infection is defined as the isolation of *C. trachomatis* by culture, or demonstration of *C. trachomatis* in a clinical specimen by detection of antigen or nucleic acid.

Chlamydia first became reportable in Illinois in July 1987. From 1992 through 2002, the number of reported cases increased 90 percent, from 25,253 to 48,101. Reasons for the increase include improved surveillance procedures, increased testing and the use of more sensitive diagnostic tests. Adolescents ages 15-19 years accounted for 33 percent (15,898) of chlamydia cases reported in Illinois during 2002 and had an incidence rate of 1,778.3 compared to 387.3 for the total Illinois population. The average age, where age was known, of reported chlamydia cases during 2002 was 23 years: 25 years for males and 22 years for females.

Chlamydia screening programs target women because they are frequently asymptomatic and the complications of untreated infection are severe. Because screening programs test clients regardless of symptoms, they help to establish the prevalence of infection in population groups. During recent years, as testing has become more widely available and affordable, screening programs have been expanded in STD clinics, school-based health centers and women's health programs such as family planning clinics, prenatal clinics, and adult and juvenile correctional centers. Illinois chlamydia screening sites conducted more than 200,000 chlamydia tests during 2002 (46,920 in men and 159,546 in women); the positivity rate was 7.3 percent: 6.3 percent for females and 10.5 percent for males. Adolescents, especially adolescent females, are at particular risk for chlamydia infection. The positivity rate in 2002 for chlamydia screening site specimens from females ages 15-24 was 15.3 percent from STD clinics, 12.4 percent from school-based health clinics and 19.5 percent from adult and juvenile correctional centers. Positivity rates for chlamydia screening site specimens during the second half of 2002 increased because of the implementation in June 2002 of a nucleic acid amplified test (NAAT) at IDPH laboratories (Figure 1a).





2002 Chlamydia Epidemiologic Profile

Trends

Reported cases of chlamydia increased 10 percent (43,716 to 48,101) in Illinois during 2002 compared to 2001. There was a 10 percent (21,296 to 23,428) increase in Illinois excluding Chicago and a 10 percent (22,420 to 24,673) increase in Chicago (Figure 1).

Where

During 2002, of the 48,101 cases of chlamydia reported in Illinois, 24,673 (51%) were reported from Chicago and 23,428 (49%) from Illinois excluding Chicago. The case rate per 100,000 population was 387.3 for Illinois, 852.0 for Chicago, and 246.0 for Illinois excluding Chicago.

Cases were reported from all of the 102 counties in Illinois. The greatest number of cases was reported from Cook County, 30,822 (64%). The highest incidence rates per 100,000 population were reported from the following five counties: Alexander, 667.4 (64 cases); St. Clair, 595.9 (1,526 cases); Cook, 573.2 (30,822 cases); Peoria, 568.6 (1,043 cases); and Macon, 527.4 (605 cases) (Figure 2).

Who

The racial distribution of cases during 2002 was 49 percent African American (23,754), 22 percent white (10,676), less than 1 percent Asian/Pacific Islander and Native American (246), and 28 percent other or unknown race (13,425) (Figure 3). Eight percent (3,917) of cases were Hispanic. The highest case rate was among African Americans, 1,265.6.


Adolescents and young adults ages 15-24 years accounted for 71 percent (33,872) of reported cases where age was known during 2002 (Figure 4).

The ratio of identified and reported female cases to males during 2002 was 2.45:1.00. This ratio likely overestimates the true ratio because of screening programs that target females. During recent years, testing in males has increased. Cases among males increased 32 percent (10,588 to 13,942) during 2002 compared to 2001 (Figure 5).

Hospitals and private physician offices reported the greatest percentage of chlamydia cases during 2002, 54 percent (26,005). Other providers included STD clinics, 15 percent (7,159); correctional facilities, 11 percent (5,290); and family planning clinics, 10 percent (5,007).

By County, 2002



Illinois Reported Chlamydia by Race, 2002



Illinois Reported Chlamydia by Age Group,* 2002







2002 Gonorrhea Summary

Gonorrhea is a bacterial infection caused by *Neisseria gonorrhoeae*. Uncomplicated urogenital infection may progress, without treatment, to complications such as pelvic inflammatory disease (PID), infertility and disseminated infection. Resultant scarring of fallopian tubes can cause ectopic pregnancy. Women are more likely than men to suffer complications from gonorrhea infection because early symptoms are often not present or so mild as to not be recognized by the female. Infants born to infected mothers may develop gonococcal ophthalmia, which is potentially blinding, or sepsis, arthritis or meningitis.


In Illinois, a case of gonorrhea is defined as isolation of typical gram-negative, oxidase positive diplococci (presumptive *N. gonorrhoeae*) from a clinical specimen; demonstration of *N. gonorrhoeae* in a clinical specimen by detection of antigen or nucleic acid; or observation of Gram-negative intracellular diplococci in a male urethral or female endocervical smear.

From 1992 through 2002, reported cases of gonorrhea decreased by 18 percent, from 29,275 to 24,026. Reported cases increased by only one case (24,025 to 24,026) during 2002 compared to 2001. Despite the negligible statewide increase, there were several local outbreaks. Eleven local health departments that reported at least 10 cases during 2002 in their jurisdictions recorded increases of more than 50 percent compared to 2001.

Many currently available lab tests have the capability to identify chlamydia and gonorrhea from the same specimen, thus eliminating the need for collecting two specimens. Implementation and expansion of chlamydia screening programs therefore has resulted in the additional benefit of increased testing for gonorrhea. The positivity rate decreased between 1998 and 2002 because of more screening and a general decline in gonorrhea incidence (Figure 2a). Illinois gonorrhea testing and screening sites processed more than 206,000 gonorrhea tests during 2002 (47,082 from males and 159,586 from females). The positivity rate in 2002 was 4.2 percent: 2.4 percent for females and 10.4 percent for males. The highest positivity rates were reported from STD clinics (10.2%), hospitals (8.0%), correctional facilities (5.3%) and school based clinics (4.5%).

Teens and young adults are disproportionately affected by gonorrhea in Illinois. Infected persons ages 15-24 years accounted for 61 percent (14,667 of 24,026) of reported cases during 2002. The case rate for adolescents ages 15-19 years was 731.8 compared to 193.5 for the total Illinois population. The average age of reported gonorrhea cases during 2002, where age was known, was 25 years: 27 years for males and 23 years for females.

2002 Gonorrhea Epidemiologic Profile

Trends

Reported cases of gonorrhea increased by one case (24,025 to 24,026) in Illinois during 2002 compared to 2001. There was a 5 percent (9,699 to 10,212) increase in Illinois excluding Chicago and a 4 percent (14,326 to 13,814) decrease in Chicago (Figure 6).

Where

The total number of gonorrhea cases reported during 2002 in Illinois was 24,026: 13,814 (57%) in Chicago and 10,212 (43%) in Illinois excluding Chicago. The case rate per 100,000 population was 193.5 for Illinois, 477.0 for Chicago and 107.2 for Illinois excluding Chicago.

Cases were reported from 91 of the 102 counties in Illinois. The greatest number of cases was reported from Cook County, 16,632 (69%). The highest incidence rates per 100,000 population were reported from the following five counties: Pulaski, 394.7 (29 cases); Macon, 352.2 (404 cases); Sangamon, 343.5 (649 cases); Peoria, 342.4 (628 cases); and St. Clair, 327.6 (839 cases) (Figure 7).

Who

The racial distribution of reported cases during 2002 was 66 percent African American (15,753), 11 percent white (2,710), 0 percent Asian/Pacific Islander (31), 0 percent Native American (17), and 23 percent other or unknown race (5,515) (Figure 8). Three percent (704) of cases were among Hispanics. African Americans had the highest case rate among racial groups during 2002, but the case rate decreased 40 percent between 1992 and 2002, from 1,396.9 to 839.3.


Adolescents and young adults ages 15-24 years accounted for 60 percent (14,667) of reported gonorrhea cases where age was known during 2002 (Figure 9).

Reported cases increased 1 percent (12,178 to 12,273) among females and decreased 1 percent (11,845 to 11,750) among males during 2002 compared to 2001. Females accounted for 51 percent of cases during 2002 (Figure 10).

Hospitals and private physician offices reported 56 percent (13,179) of gonorrhea cases during 2001. Other reporting facilities included STD clinics, 28 percent (6,815); correctional facilities, 6 percent (1,369); and family planning clinics, 5 percent (1,288).

Illinois Gonorrhea Case Rates by County, 2002



Illinois Reported Gonorrhea by Race, 2002



Illinois Reported Gonorrhea by Age Group,* 2002





Illinois Reported Gonorrhea Cases By Gender, 1992-2002





2002 Syphilis Summary

Syphilis is a systemic disease caused by the spirochete *Treponema pallidum*. The infection is diagnosed through microscopic examination of lesion exudates and through serologic testing. *Early syphilis* refers to syphilis of less than one year duration. Untreated, it progresses through three stages: *primary* and *secondary*, which are characterized by infectious lesions, rashes and other systemic manifestations, and *early latent*, with no signs or symptoms present at the time of diagnosis. Public health disease intervention efforts emphasize control of early syphilis because persons with early syphilis are most likely to have been infectious within the past year.

The number of early syphilis cases in Illinois is small in comparison to gonorrhea and chlamydia. However, significant public health resources must be devoted to control of syphilis for several reasons. Untreated syphilis can result in complications that include neurological or cardiovascular damage. Syphilis also can be transmitted to a fetus from an infected woman during pregnancy. This condition, called *congenital syphilis*, can cause stillbirth and severe illness or death to the infected newborn. The open lesions and resultant enhanced immune response during primary and secondary syphilis can increase the risk of HIV transmission and acquisition for infected persons by three- to five-fold.

Primary and Secondary Syphilis

Reported primary and secondary syphilis cases in Illinois decreased 80 percent between 1992, when 2,380 cases were reported, and 2002 when there were only 479 reported cases. However, the number and distribution of reported cases increased in 2002 compared to 2001. During this latter time period, there was a 17 percent increase (409 to 479) in reported cases and the number of counties reporting cases increased from 16 to 25. Six counties reported local outbreaks of syphilis during 2002: Champaign, Cook, Kane, Lake, Vermilion and Winnebago.

During 2002, reported primary and secondary syphilis cases increased 53 percent (137 to 209) among whites. Cases increased 49 percent (134 to 200) among white males and 200 percent (3 to 9) among white females. White males accounted for 42 percent of all reported cases in 2002 and 50 percent of male cases. The highest primary and secondary syphilis case rate (10.7) was reported among African Americans. However, there was a 5 percent (211 to 201) decrease in reported cases among African Americans in 2002 compared to 2001. African Americans accounted for 80 percent of the 81 female cases in 2002 compared to 42 percent of the 398 male cases.

Syphilis is identified more frequently among older age groups than gonorrhea and chlamydia. The average age, where age was known, of reported primary and secondary syphilis cases increased from 34 years in 2001 to 36 years in 2002. During 2002, the average age was 36 years for males and 33 years for females.

An outbreak of syphilis among men who have sex with men (MSM) resulted in a 25 percent increase in reported primary and secondary syphilis among men during 2002 compared to 2001. In 2002, of the 398 males reported with primary and secondary syphilis, 251 (63 percent) were MSM. Eighty percent of MSM were white and 49 percent were co-infected with HIV. (Only three females were co-infected with HIV.) HIV co-infection can lead to rapid disease progression into neurologic manifestations of syphilis. During 2002, there was a 74 percent increase (23 to 40) in reported neurosyphilis compared to 2001; 31 (78 percent) of the 2002 cases were among men.



2002 Primary and Secondary Syphilis Epidemiologic Profile

Trends

Reported primary and secondary syphilis increased 17 percent (409 to 479) in Illinois during 2002 compared to 2001. There was a 37 percent (92 to 126) increase in Illinois excluding Chicago and an 11 percent (317 to 353) increase in Chicago (Figure 11).

Where

The total number of primary and secondary syphilis cases reported during 2002 in Illinois was 479: 353 (74%) in Chicago and 126 (26%) in Illinois excluding Chicago. The case rate per 100,000 population was 3.9 for Illinois, 12.2 for Chicago, and 1.3 for Illinois excluding Chicago.

Cases were reported from 23 of the 102 counties in Illinois, an increase from the 16 counties with reported cases in 2001. Most cases were reported from Cook County, 408 (85%). The highest incidence rates per 100,000 population were reported from the following five counties that reported at least three cases in 2002: Cook, 7.6; Vermilion, 7.1; Winnebago, 5.7; Champaign, 3.9; and Madison, 2.3 (Figure 12).

Who

The racial distribution of cases during 2002 was 44 percent white (209), 42 percent African American (201), 0 percent Asian/Pacific Islander and Native American (0) and 14 percent other or unknown race (69) (Figure 13). Twelve percent (56) of cases were Hispanic. The case rate increased among whites by 53 percent (1.5 to 2.3) during 2002 compared to 2001. African Americans had the highest case rate among racial groups during 2002, but the rate decreased 46 percent from 1999 (19.7) to 2002 (10.7).


Adults ages 30-44 years accounted for 57 percent (274) of primary and secondary syphilis cases reported in Illinois during 2002 (Figure 14).

The number of reported cases decreased 11 percent (91 to 81) among females and increased 25 percent (318 to 398) among males during 2002 compared to 2001. The ratio of reported male cases to females during 2002 was 4.9:1.0 (Figure 15).

STD clinics reported 55 percent (265) of primary and secondary syphilis cases during 2002. Other reporting facilities included private physicians, 28 percent (132); hospitals, 8 percent (39); correctional facilities, 5 percent (25); and other facilities, 4 percent (18).

Illinois Primary and Secondary Syphilis Case Rates by County, 2002



Illinois Reported Primary and Secondary Syphilis by Race, 2002



Illinois Reported Primary and Secondary Syphilis by Age Group, 2002




Congenital Syphilis

Congenital syphilis is a condition caused by infection *in utero* with *Treponema pallidum*. A wide spectrum of clinical signs exist and not all cases are clinically apparent at birth. The surveillance case definition is outlined in the MMWR edition May 02, 1997 / 46(RR10); 1-55. This is not a clinical definition but a sensitive (nonspecific) surveillance definition. As a result, the reported cases likely overestimate the actual number of cases but such a surveillance system helps to ensure that infants with congenital syphilis will not be missed by the public health system.

Reported congenital syphilis cases in Illinois decreased 90 percent (396 to 41) between 1992 and 2002. The 2002 rate was 22.2 cases per 100,000 live births (2001 live birth statistics), the lowest in more than 10 years. African Americans were disproportionately represented among reported congenital syphilis cases, accounting for 83 percent (34) of cases.

In 2002, 68 percent of mothers of congenital syphilis cases received prenatal care. Treatment of an infected woman during early pregnancy can prevent infection of the fetus or cure an already infected fetus to prevent further complications. Illinois law (410 ILCS 320/1) requires screening for syphilis at the first prenatal visit and again during the third trimester.

2002 Congenital Syphilis Epidemiologic Profile

Trends

Reported congenital syphilis decreased 9 percent (45 to 41) in Illinois during 2002 compared to 2001. There was a 22 percent (9 to 11) increase in Illinois excluding Chicago and a 17 percent (36 to 30) decrease in Chicago (Figure 16).

Where

The total number of congenital syphilis cases reported during 2002 in Illinois was 41: 30 (73%) in Chicago and 11 (27%) in Illinois excluding Chicago. The case rate per 100,000 live births was 22.3 for Illinois, 60.5 for Chicago and 8.2 for Illinois excluding Chicago.

Cases were reported from eight of the 102 counties in Illinois, compared to five counties with reported cases in 2001. The number of reported cases and case rates, respectively, for these counties were as follows: Cook, 32 (38.0); St. Clair, 2 (54.0); McHenry, 2 (48.5); Winnebago, 1 (25.4); McLean, 1 (49.0); Will, 1 (11.5); Lake, 1 (9.3); and DuPage, 1 (7.5) (Figure 17).

Who

The racial distribution of cases during 2002 was 83 percent African American (34), 15 percent white (6) and 2 percent other or unknown race (1) (Figure 18). Ten percent (4) of cases were among Hispanics.

The ages of women who delivered an infant with congenital syphilis during 2002 ranged from 20 to 40 years, with the 20-24 year age group accounting for the largest percentage of cases. The average age of the mothers was 29 years (Figure 19).



2002






2002 Genital Herpes Summary

Genital herpes is a contagious viral infection that affects an estimated 45 million Americans (more than one in five). The infection is caused by the herpes simplex virus (HSV). It is usually acquired through sexual contact with someone infected with genital herpes. There are two types of HSV: HSV-1 and HSV-2. HSV-1 usually causes sores on the lips known as fever blisters or cold sores, but it also can cause genital symptoms. HSV-2 most often causes painful genital lesions, but also can affect the mouth. HSV, like other genital ulcer diseases, increases the risk of acquiring or transmitting HIV by providing a point of entry for the virus. Pregnant women who develop a primary episode of genital herpes can pass the virus to their fetus, which may cause spontaneous abortion, premature delivery or potentially fatal neonatal infection. HSV remains in certain nerve cells throughout a person's life, causing periodic symptoms and/or viral shedding. Many persons infected with HSV never notice symptoms, but can still transmit the virus to others because of this intermittent viral shedding. This life-long ability to unknowingly transmit the virus is one of the reasons that HSV is so prevalent among sexually active adults.

The IDPH Division of Laboratories began performing herpes viral tissue culture testing on specimens submitted by Illinois STD clinics in December 1999. Between 2000 and 2002, the number of specimens submitted annually for herpes testing increased 70 percent (435 to 772) (Figure 20). Of the 361 specimens (47%) that were positive in 2002, 76 (21%) were identified as HSV-1 and 285 (79%) were identified as HSV-2 (Figure 21).




2002 Hepatitis Summary

Hepatitis is a viral infection that causes inflammation of the liver. There are several types of the virus, including hepatitis A, B, and C. Some hepatitis viruses (B and C) can spread by sexual contact and injection drug use. Hepatitis A (HAV) is typically spread by the fecal-oral route. Infection with the hepatitis B virus (HBV) can be mild or severe, or may cause no symptoms. HBV is spread by direct contact with blood or body fluids of infected people, most commonly by sharing drug needles, through sexual contact or from an infected mother to her infant during childbirth. Among adults, 90 percent to 94 percent of persons infected with HBV recover completely and have no long-term effects. However, 6 percent to 10 percent become chronic carriers of the virus and are at risk of developing cirrhosis or liver cancer. In Illinois, there were 185 reported cases of HBV and 262 HAV in 2002. HCV was made reportable in July 2002 and 13 acute cases were reported that year.

Beginning in 2001, Illinois STD clinics (excluding those in Chicago) began offering HBV vaccinations to eligible clients (at least 18 years old and never vaccinated for HBV). Of the 19,187 eligible clients in 2002 at 29 STD clinics, 29.0 percent (5,559) received the first dose of the three-dose hepatitis B vaccine series; 45.9 percent of those clients beginning the series returned for the second dose and 22.2 percent returned for the third dose (Figure 22).

In 2002, using grant funds from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), hepatitis A and B vaccination and hepatitis C testing programs were integrated into six pilot sites. These sites were existing programs serving clients considered to be at increased risk of hepatitis infection, such as men who have sex with men (MSM) and injection drug users (IDU). The vaccine acceptance rate was higher for these clients than for clients offered the vaccine at STD clinics. IDUs are offered hepatitis C testing. Of those tested in 2002, the positivity rate was 30.4 percent (Figure


STD Clinic Behavioral Data Collection

In 2002, the IDPH STD Section collected behavioral data from 39 STD clinics in Illinois excluding Chicago and the hepatitis vaccination/testing pilot sites. Staff at these clinics submit to IDPH a scannable behavioral risk assessment survey (RAS) for each client clinic visit. The forms are scanned into a database by IDPH. IDPH is then able to tabulate both statewide and individual clinic data, including the number of STD clinic visits by month, age, race, gender and clinical impression/diagnosis (Figure 24) as well as behavioral risk information. Data for non-reportable STDs such as human papilloma virus (HPV or genital warts) and herpes are included (Figure 25).

Behavioral risk information on the RAS can be linked to the IDPH laboratory STD test result by the laboratory specimen bar code. The table on the following page provides summary disease-specific information collected in 2002 (Figure 26).

The data collection system is based on visits and not individual clients; therefore, clients may be counted more than once per year. In 2002, risk assessment data were collected for 32,605 client visits.

By Quarter, 7/01-12/02






