Ship ICC Role Discussion	 Data for annual report should be tracked over time to encourage others to follow the progress. Keep same documents and update yearly. Some wanted to add legislative requirements and questioned if we will make progress without it. Will review current law to see if a requirement needs to be added. For priority areas, suggestion to meet with action teams with co-chairs for each group. They were very involved in planning council. Look at what other ICCs from other states are doing. See how SHIP can be utilized going forward. Make sure state agencies are involved and engaged. ICC would like Director Shah's input and would like an individual from HFS on agenda for the next meeting. 	T. Hughes volunteered to draft legislative mandate for annual report if needed.

Reports on Activities Aligning with SHIP

Reports

- Discussed mental health, aligning with HHS goals, 1115 waiver:
 - o Original target date: July 1. There was a delay due to the change in administration. If waiver is approved, we do not know when that might happen.
 - o Waiver advisory council originally planned to meet every two weeks. They still meet, but not as frequently as planned. There are approximately 30 individuals in the group.

Family-to-Family Health Information Center

• Staffed by family members of people with special healthcare needs. Any diagnosis up to age 21. Would like consumers to have input on what impacts them. Unmet need: MH needs for publicly-insured children.

IDPH Div. of Health Data and Policy

- Opioid updates
 - o Opioid OD Semi-annual report submitted in June
 - o State strategic plan with data report to be released in August

Q: What happens to babies with NAS and if they are referred anywhere?

- o High-risk infant follow-up programs at local health departments
- <u>IDPH Office of Women's Health and Family Services:</u>
 - o Rule change, levels of care, align Illinois levels of care with recommendations with AAP
 - o Severe maternal morbidity, what are the trends, issues, etc. in order to improve outcomes for women
 - o Implementing quality improvement
 - o Illinois Perinatal Quality Collaborative look at systems alignment

DHS Division of Mental Health

Looking into change in data collection within Division of Mental Health – related specifically to services that are publicly-funded. Change focus in paying for volume of services vs paying for outcomes. Applied for a couple of grants – states to apply with community providers.

Develop center for excellence in integration:

o Reduced deaths due to BH crisis, SAMHSA grant opportunities, youth suicides
