Briefly describe the geographic area your proposed project will impact. The geographic area served by this grant will be the cities of Urbana and Champaign IL. Urbana is the county seat of Champaign County, Illinois. As of the 2010 census, the population was 41,250. Urbana borders the city of Champaign and is the tenth-most populous city in Illinois outside of the Chicago metropolitan area. Most of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign campus is located here. Urbana is part of the Urbana-Champaign micro-urban community. City planning maps from January 2010 indicate that the total area is now 11.7 square miles (30 km2). According to the Federal definitions of Metropolitan Statistical Areas Urbana is designated as "Other Urban/Suburban (excluding Chicago Metro Area)".

According to the 2010 census, the population for C-U is 41,250 (Urbana) and 81,055 (Champaign). Urbana has14,327 households and Champaign has 30,712. The population density for Urbana was 3,468.3 people per square mile (1,339.6/km²) and 3,613.2 for Champaign. The racial makeup of the cities was White: 60.4% (Urbana) 67.8% (Champaign); African American 16.3% (Urbana) 15.6% (Champaign); Asian 17.8% (Urbana) 10.6% (Champaign); Pacific Islander 0.04% (Urbana) .1% (Champaign), Native American 0.18% (Urbana) .3% (Champaign); other races 2.1% (Urbana), and two or more races 3.1% (Urbana) 3% (Champaign). Hispanic or Latino of any race were 5.2% (Urbana) and 6.3% (Champaign).

The median income for a household in Urbana was \$34,951 and \$40,116 in Champaign. A full 54% of Urbana residents over the age of 25 have a college or advanced degree, 48.1% in Champaign. Urbana is home to two Regional Medical Centers; Carle Hospital and Clinic and Covenant Medical Center.
